

**Minnesota PMAP+ Renewal
Childless Adult Expansion Request**

On March 10, 2011, the State requested to include childless adults with income between 75-133% of the Federal poverty level (FPL) into the State's section 1115(a). The chart below outlines the State's initial request, and CMS' counter proposal as it relates specifically to the childless adult expansion group.

State's Initial Request	CMS' Counter Proposal
6-month Waiting Period for non-State Residents	Allow the State to impose, as a condition of eligibility into the Demonstration, a 6-month period in which this population enrolls into the State-only funded MinnesotaCare program. This expenditure authority, however, would be time limited, i.e., through September 1, 2011, to enable the State to remove the 6-month waiting period for non-State residents from State law.
Self-declaration of Citizenship	Allow the State to utilize the 90-day reasonable opportunity period in order to make the appropriate system changes. This, however, should not be an issue given that all childless adults would have to be in the State-only funded MinnesotaCare before becoming eligible for the Demonstration. The State would have enough time to make the appropriate system changes before this population could be eligible for the Demonstration.
Payment for Incarcerated MinnesotaCare Participants	Allow the State to maintain incarcerated individuals in the Demonstration; however, CMS would add language in the STCs regarding the prohibition of FFP for these individuals, as well as language requiring the State to reconcile on a quarterly basis to ensure no FFP is inadvertently claimed for this population.
Asset Test Waiver	CMS would grant the State its requested waiver. No counter proposal offered.
