PROPOSED ORDER

This matter came before the Court upon the motion made by Plaintiff Tony Webster. Based upon the files, records, and proceedings herein,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Within 30 days of this Order, Defendant City of Bloomington shall provide Plaintiff Webster with access to inspect all data in its original form that is responsive to Plaintiff's request made on December 23, 2014. Specifically, Defendant City of Bloomington shall:
 - A. Provide Plaintiff Webster with access to inspect all responsive data, including metadata, and any other category of data, regardless of its format or description;
 - B. Include among the data provided any data previously offered to Plaintiff Webster for inspection, in the form that it was originally provided; and
 - C. Allow Plaintiff Webster to use his own equipment to inspect responsive data or provide the necessary and sufficient equipment or software to inspect responsive data.

2. Within 14 days of this Order, Defendant City of Bloomington shall provide to the Court:
 - A. A written statement to the Court and Plaintiff Webster detailing any data responsive to Plaintiff's request which may have been lost or deleted; and
 - B. For in camera review, any data Defendant believes is properly classified so as to deny Plaintiff access, and for any data so classified, shall cite the specific statutory section, temporary classification, or specific provision of federal law on which the denial for access is based.
3. Defendant shall maintain and preserve all data responsive to the request made on December 23, 2014.
