I am requesting access to government data under the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act (Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 13). Through this request, I am seeking to inspect and/or copy public data created, produced, received, maintained or disseminated between the dates Nov. 1, 2015 and Dec. 1, 2015 related to the following:

- All correspondence, including emails and text messages, between the governor, lt. governor or their staff and the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension regarding the governor's viewing of an ambulance video related to the shooting of Jamar Clark.
- All correspondence, including emails and text messages, among staff in the governor and/or lt. governor's office related to the viewing of the video.

If responsive data are found, I would first like the opportunity to inspect such data, prior to identifying specific sub-sets of data to copy.

Please consider this letter a formal request for the indefinite retention of the requested data, pending the resolution of its status.

As required by section 13.03, Subd. 3(f) of the Minnesota Statutes, I am requesting that in the event that any portion of my request is not granted, you certify in writing that the request has been denied, and cite the specific statutory section, temporary classification, or other provision of law upon which the denial was based.

This request is made as part of news gathering, and is not for commercial use.
