RE: Aircraft Registration and Licensing

Dear Business Owner:

The MnDOT Office of Aeronautics is aware of your commercial aircraft operations involving the use of an Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS). MnDOT's records indicate that your aircraft is not currently registered and the company's commercial operations are not licensed in accordance with Minnesota State law.

THIS IS A CEASE AND DESIST ORDER. Aircraft registration is required by Minnesota law. Commercial operators are required to be licensed in the State of Minnesota. Under state law your company is prohibited from using or operating an aircraft in the air space over this state until the aircraft has been registered and you obtain a commercial operations license. You must cease operations immediately until your company comes into compliance. Each violation constitutes a separate misdemeanor. You will be referred for prosecution if you do not comply.

These are the steps you must follow:

1. Obtain an N-Number for your aircraft from the FAA;
2. Obtain Section 333 Exemption and Certificate of Authorization (COA) from the FAA;
3. Register your aircraft with MnDOT; and
4. Obtain a commercial operations license from MnDOT.

MnDOT makes it easy to become registered and licensed. Aircraft registration and commercial operator licensing is available in person, over the phone or online:
