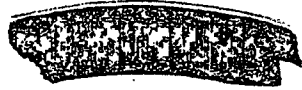

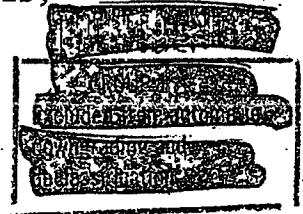

RESIDENCE AND EMPLOYMENT

By means of a suitable pretext, it was determined by a Special Agent of the FBI on August 18, 1969, that MARVIN ALLEN DAVIDOV is employed as manager of the Liberty House, 529 Cedar Avenue, Minneapolis, Minnesota, and resides at 719 5th Avenue Southeast, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The April 15, 1969, issue of "The Minnesota Daily", a student newspaper which is published at the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota, carried an article on page one announcing the grand opening of Liberty House, 529 Cedar Avenue, Minneapolis, a profitable, non-profit organization that sells to the rich and gives to the poor.

According to the article, MARVIN DAVIDOV is the manager of Liberty House, which sells a multitude of handicraft products made in ten Mississippi co-operatives, and the profits will be returned to these co-ops.

ACTIVITY

LA T-1 (12/11/67 - 5/3/68)

MARVIN ALLEN DAVIDOV participated as indicated below in the following activities:

At an anti-war rally sponsored by the Peace Action Council (PAC) (See Appendix) October 15, 1967, at East Los Angeles Junior College Stadium, Los Angeles, California, DAVIDOV went to the speaker's platform and burned what he said was his draft card.

DAVIDOV was observed at an anti-war demonstration held at the Los Angeles Federal Building on North Los Angeles Street, October 16, 1967, sponsored by The Resistance (See Appendix). At the demonstration, speakers criticized U. S. war involvement, and several draft cards were burned.

DAVIDOV attended a Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) (See Appendix) sponsored meeting October 16, 1967 in Los Angeles where plans were made to demonstrate at an induction center the next day.

On October 16, 1967, DAVIDOV attended a demonstration at the Armed Forces Induction Center, 1031 South Broadway, Los Angeles, sponsored by the SDS and The Resistance. Nineteen persons were arrested for blocking the entrance but DAVIDOV was not among those arrested.

On October 24, 1967, DAVIDOV was observed at an anti-war demonstration sponsored by SDS directed against former Secretary of State, DEAN RUSK, at the Century Plaza Hotel in West Los Angeles, California. The demonstration was without incident.

DAVIDOV was one of six leaders of an anti-war demonstration march to the Los Angeles Federal Building at 312 North Spring Street. The march was held December 4, 1967, sponsored by The Resistance and was without incident.

On January 3, 1968, DAVIDOV was observed at an anti-draft demonstration at the Federal Building on Spring Street in Los Angeles. The demonstrators proceeded to the 11th floor and presented the U. S. Attorney with an enlarged replica of a draft card bearing the name of an individual being prosecuted for a Selective Service violation.

On February 16, 1968, DAVIDOV attended an anti-war demonstration sponsored by the Dow Action Committee (See Appendix) held in the front of the Dow Office on Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles. The demonstration was without incident.

DAVIDOV was present at a Resistance-sponsored anti-war demonstration at a Los Angeles induction center on February 20, 1968, March 5, 1968, and March 12, 1968. Leaflets were distributed to inductees urging them to refuse the draft, but there were no incidents or arrests.

On April 6, 1968, DAVIDOV attended an SDS-sponsored demonstration at the Federal Building on North Los Angeles Street, Los Angeles, allegedly in memorial to Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

On April 3, 1968, at the University of Southern California Religious Center, The Resistance held an anti-war demonstration and DAVIDOV was observed in attendance. The demonstration was without incident.

On April 3, 1967, the PAC sponsored an anti-war parade and demonstration to Los Angeles City Hall. DAVIDOV was observed in attendance. Numerous anti-war speeches were given but there was no violence.

LA T-2 (12/13/67)

On December 5, 1967, at a meeting of the Long Beach Young Democrats, Long Beach, California, DAVIDOV was introduced as a guest speaker. He told the audience that

he felt the "only way the genocidal and racism practices of this country would be altered would be by revolution." He stated revolution meant to him "the complete withdrawal of cooperation from institutions which made war and support racism." He then touted the activities of The Resistance.

LA T-3 (11/7/67)

On November 2, 1967, DAVIDOV attended the New Left School (See Appendix) in Los Angeles where a class in Russian was being taught.

LA T-4 (1/4/68)

On December 17, 1969, in the city of Torrance, California, the PAC sponsored a protest against the Dow Chemical Company and DAVIDOV was observed in the demonstration which was conducted without incident.
