The following persons spoke. A short comment concerning their speech is contained following their name:

ALLEN GINSBURG - Read a very boscene poem which was anti-war in nature.

M.S. ARNONI - Likened US actions in Vietnam to Germany in World War II.

- JERRY RUBIN - Stated that he, MARILYN MILLIGAN, and STEVE WEISSMAN had been elected as a three-man committee from the nine committees to make decisions on the march. Stated that if turned back on the march by Oakland PD, they would march tomorrow, or next week with a national group and would march until they made it through Oakland to the OAT. Stated that the bigger the protest they organize, the less civil liberties they have.
- FRANZ SCHURMANN - Talked on the peaceful solutions to the Vietnam War - stated we should negotiate with the NLF is obviously an appendage of North Vietnam. Stated that bombing of North Vietnam is only building patriotism in that area. Stated that The Chinese are using the war for their own ends just as the US is doing, and neither side cares how many Vietnamese are killed. Said the US is becoming a militaristic society because our democracy is lacking in a consensus of the populace. Said the US is losing respect in the world because we are losing our idealism.
- GARY GOODROW - Member of "The Committee" - was an emcee of the program and was very anti-US policy in his statements.
- ALAN MYERSON - Made a pitch for money. Stated that the VDC needed \$15,000 to make expenses.
- JOE MACDONALD - Songwriter - advertised a record on the Watts situation.
- MARILYN MILLIGAN - Announced workshop meetings are to be held concerning future activities.
- STEVE WEISSMAN - Attacked the policies of GERALD COAKLEY, District Attorney. Stated that MIKE DELACOUR was one of the back-up men for the Committee of Three.
