

- Lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes.

At that time I administered a field breath test, which indicated a .05 BAC.

It should be noted that CLARK did have a few cuts on his face and he had a cloth that he was wiping blood from his cheek with. He indicated that he was fine at that time.

All passengers had minor injuries however WERNER was later transported to the Rice Memorial Hospital with minor injuries.

It should be noted that there was a press release regarding this incident and the possibility of the auto pilot of the vehicle malfunctioning and causing the crash. There were national headlines that were brought up and CLARK was made aware of the press release and the possibility of the auto pilot being the cause of the crash.

It should be noted that on the evening of 7-16-17, I received a voicemail from CLARK indicating that he did not believe it was the auto pilot that caused the crash and that he wanted to talk to me further about what happened. I attempted to make contact with him however was unsuccessful at that time.
