I do agree, yes. Meant to send you a text earlier and got distracted by other things. Until we better understand the scope of the issue, not the best time to initiate something new and potentially high profile.

At BTAA SRO meeting last November, every school there (besides us) was refusing Huawei money — even gifts (Wisconsin was NOT at that meeting, but ~11 schools were). Mostly related to the language in the Defense Reauthorization bill, but they felt writing was on wall and didn't want to take any risks (many having MUCH larger DOD portfolios). I noted the McCarthy-esque look of such behavior, but was a minority of one...

The new indictments only up the pressure, of course.
